



SR 29 FROM CR 80A (COWBOY WAY) TO US 27 Project Overview

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

The Florida Department of Transportation, District One, is performing a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) study on a segment of State Road (SR) 29 that runs from CR 80A (Cowboy Way) to US 27 in Hendry and Glades Counties. This evaluation is necessary due to ongoing population growth, increasing truck traffic in and around the study area, and the need for enhanced inland north-south evacuation routes. The provision of safe and efficient transportation to support this growth requires action to improve the existing transportation network.

PLANNING, DESIGN, RIGHT OF WAY AND CONSTRUCTION

The PD&E study is scheduled for completion in 2016. The design phase of the project is expected to begin in 2016 upon completion of the PD&E study.

PROJECT OVERVIEW

This roadway improvement consists of increasing capacity on SR 29 between CR 80A (Cowboy Way) to US 27 in Hendry and Glades County. The project involves evaluating the widening of the existing 2-lane undivided segment of SR 29 to four lanes, as well as the study of an alternative corridor(s) that could potentially bypass downtown LaBelle.
